

Weekly Notes from Akiuk Memorial School

Our Superintendent, Daniel Walker, has tasked all Principals with sending notes to him on Thursday each week. These notes (about our week) are then shared with the LKSD School Board. Here are some excerpts:

Aug 17: After the districtwide VTC on Monday, Akiuk Memorial School had a stellar site inservice day reviewing common goals, school expectations, and the various aspects of our complicated schedule. We have three new staff members joining us this year. One familiar face, Nikki Auhl, formerly of Akula Elitnaurvik, joined our ranks. We have a new, straight out of college, 5-12th grade social studies teacher Gina Antonioli-Schmit. And Rita Berlin accepted our position as a long-term sub in the K-1.

It's never easy being the new kid on campus but taking time on Tuesday to work on a collaborative and cooperative professional development game (led by teacher, Natalie Cowley) along with completing the agenda in a cloze format allowed for the experienced and the inexperienced to shine.

Following suit on our first day Thursday, we welcomed eight new students into our building and many teachers were inspired to play collaborative, cooperative, and communicatively challenging games with them as well. Monday we'll welcome (at least) nine more new students with our first day of PreSchool begins.

Thursday also brought our first day of school without electricity. I ended up having 2/3rds of my morning shower in the pitch black darkness before having my phone light up the bathroom with my X-Files ring tone (creepy!) and a request from my cook to bring up food from storage because everything she had planned needed to be cooked.

Aug 24: Our enrollment held steady this week at 110 students. It's an all too familiar feeling to start the school year off with 20 students more than we were funded for. An unexpected



growing pain this year is that we're blowing through our school food resources faster than usual and our frozen food order, which we don't place ourselves, was only about 2/3rds of what it usually is.

Another way in which we stumbled over our enrollment changes is that the team to complete sports physicals expected to have 40 students to see here with us. As it turns out we had 74 students looking to have a physical completed.

But no matter how big we may be feeling on any given day, we've not given up on our small school spirit. This week we've had a tight group of five graduating seniors and another seven staff members putting in countless hours of time outside of their contract to help these students find challenging but appropriate dual credit college classes. From entrance exams to University Major explanations and discussions, we've been working collectively to give students every opportunity possible to explore their post graduation goals. Everything from working to pilot four different courses to filling another hopeful graduate's schedule down to the specific half-semester-quarters worth of content we can rest easy (if we rest. when we rest.) knowing we've given our future leaders the best education we can here at Akiuk Memorial School.

They will have to write a short summary of what they read and your initials. As you all know, our classroom is a Gomez & Gomez Dual Language Model. You can help your child label things at

home in both languages. Green for Yugtun words and Blue for English words. Over the school year, we hope to see you come by, visit and help out in our classroom. We will be more than happy to have you. Lets have a great year!!!!

4th Grade Class

Welcome back to school. After a busy summer of playing and subsistence hunting and gathering, students are back into our classroom to learn. Quyana for waking up your child(rent) in the early morning to get them in school on time. As you will see in the schedule, the times have been changed and music has been added. Students are excited about music, which is taught by Pete Schneidler.

Review double plus 1 addition such as 6+5, 7+8, 8+9, 6+7. This is for automaticity, so students can answer these without counting fingers. Make sure your child(ren) read and write in their reading log. Let your child(rent) complete their homework.






FOR ALL MY CLASSES:

My students don't get homework every night, but when I give homework, it's important to me (and for their learning) that they do it!



When kids struggle or fail, it's a great way for them to learn! I hope our kids can become GOOD at failure, and by that I mean LEARNING from their mistakes and NOT GIVING UP!

Music at Akiuk Memorial School

This is our 3rd year offering music classes at Akiuk. My schedule this year:

10:26-11:23 Band 2

1:25-2:20 Music Theory

2:23-2:45 Elementary Music in Annie's Classroom

2:58-3:58 Band 1

We are off to a good start and having fun in my music classes. The Band 1 class will begin with ukuleles, and we will also cover guitar and classic band instruments like trumpet and trombone. The kids all have a good attitude and are working hard and having fun. There are a few kids in there who have had band before, and they have been patient with their new classmates, and often help them learn how to play new chords. They are already playing 9 different chords and learning quickly. The band 2 class is starting with guitar, electric guitar, bass, possibly drums, and also band instruments. They are learning more challenging chords and strum patterns on guitar, and we will be trying new band instruments and songs this year as well. The best thing you can do to help your child in my class is encourage them to practice at home. Just two or three 10-minute practices per week will make all the difference in their skills and will probably get them an A in the class.

The music theory class has been a lot of fun for me because my two senior students are so motivated and interested in the subject. They are learning all about the "math and science of music," like how to read and write musical notation (notes, rests, rhythms, etc), understanding concepts like intervals, different types of chords and chord progressions, major and minor scales and keys and their corresponding key signatures, harmony, etc.

Parents are always welcome to come watch (and even participate in!) my classes.
